PERMISSION TO BE YOURSELF

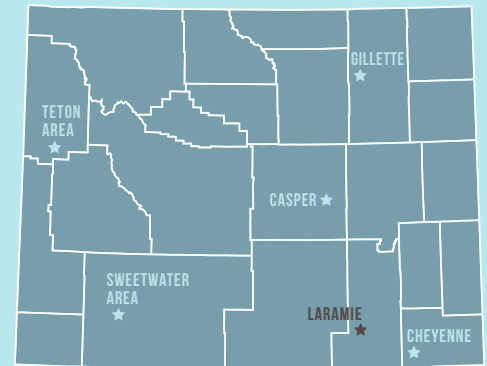
