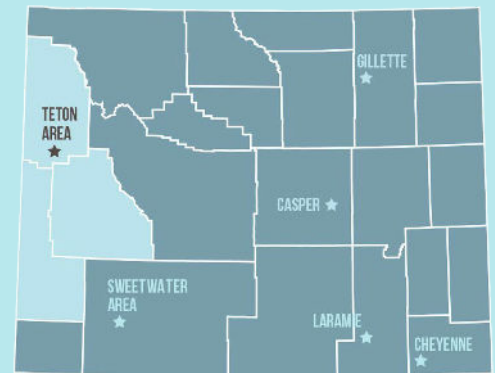
### COMMITTED TO SUCCESS
