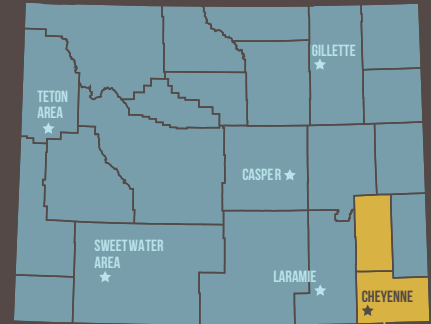
### STEPPING IT UP
