A COMMON GOAL

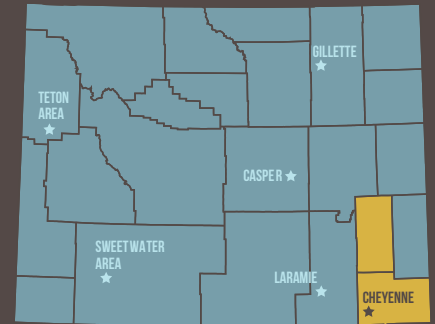
“Courage is being scared but getting in the truck anyway! Everyone in this group was heroic in learning truck driving skills and so much more during this program.
